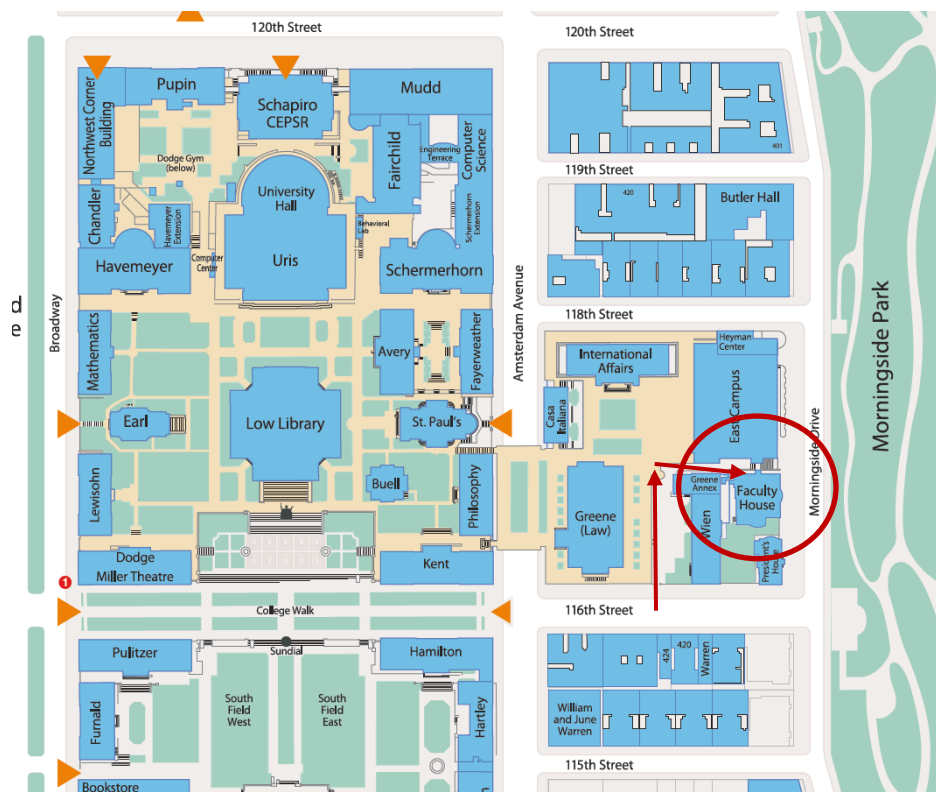

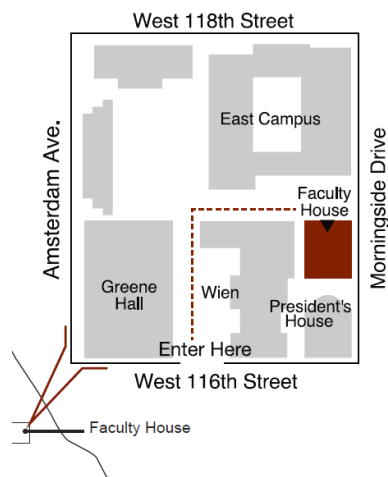
LOGISTICS

Context setting: Globally there is a gap of over \$4-5T of development financing (UN 2023). Although this gap comprises just about 3% of \$140T of Global Assets Under Management and about 4% of Global GDP, it is difficult to crowd-in this capital into the markets and countries that are most in need of it. Additionally, if ODA is used as a surrogate for capital available to crowd-in this investment through blended finance, it is only around 4% of the need at \$224B in 2023 (OECD 2023). 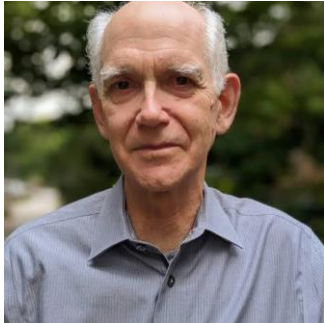

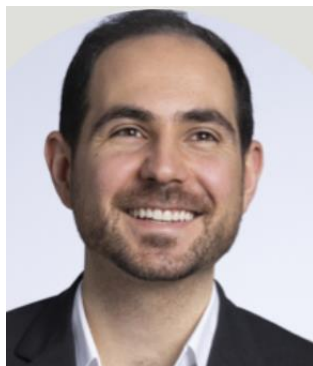


Eric Wilburn

Among other roles, Caroline serves as the President of the Alliance for Research on Corporate Sustainability (ARCS), as a Council Member of the World Economic Forum (WEF)'s Global Future Council on the future of responsible investing, and as a Trustee at Domini Impact Investments. She is an Associate Editor for both *Management Science* and the *Strategic Management Journal*.

Geoffrey Heal, Donald C. Waite III Professor Emeritus of Social Enterprise and Professor Emeritus of International and Public Affairs, is noted for contributions to economic theory and resource and environmental

Author of eighteen books and about two hundred articles, Professor Heal is a Fellow of the Econometric Society, past Managing Editor of the *Review of Economic Studies*, Past President of the Association of Environmental and Resource Economists, recipient of its prize for publications of enduring quality and a Life Fellow, and recipient of the 2013 Best Publication Prize of the European Association of Environmental and Resource Economists,.

Professor Heal chaired a committee of the National Academy of Sciences on valuing ecosystem services, was a Commissioner of the Pew Oceans Commission, was a coordinating lead author of the IPCC's Fifth Assessment Report, was a member of President Sarkozy's Commission on the Measurement of Economic Performance and Social Progress, was a member of the advisory board for the World Bank's 2010 World Development Report and the United Nations Environment Program's 2011 Human Development Report, and acts as an advisor to the World Bank on its Green Growth project.
